

How to Play Roulette

Roulette is a very popular game throughout Europe and North America. To win, predict where the ball will come to rest on the Roulette wheel.

The roulette wheel consists of numbers 1 – 36, alternately coloured red and black, plus 0 and 00, which are green. The dealer spins the Roulette wheel and spins the ball in the opposite direction.

Wagers can be placed on individual numbers or groups of numbers. To bet, simply place your chips on the numbered table layout. Inside bets are made with non-value chips, which you must purchase from the dealer prior to placing your bet. Outside bets are made with value chips or non-value chips (See page X for more details). When the ball begins to drop, the dealer will announce that there are no more bets.

Once the ball comes to rest, the dealer marks the winning number on the layout and pays all winning bets. See the chart below for payouts.
